From the Desk of *Leslie Wilcox*

Stepping into our PBS Hawaii studio, Burma's Nobel Peace Prize winner **Aung San Suu Kyi** had a formal manner, a reticence about her. This natural reserve never went away in her 35 minutes with us, but over conversation at the **Long Story Short** table, I also felt her personal warmth and connection. ... Another internationally recognized leader who visited our studio was **Dr. Vandana Shiva** of India, a scientist and food safety advocate. She came in, relaxed and comfortable, and spoke with aplomb, whether the subject was her joy in family farming or the powerful corporate opposition she faces to her strong stands on genetically modified foods. ... Both world leaders, who will be featured on PBS Hawaii this month, spoke of a deep commitment to their causes – and at the same time, a deep detachment. They say they realize they are only part of a much larger picture and they're at peace doing what they can. ... Ukulele phenom **Jake Shimabukuro** is a favorite guest to PBS Hawaii. We've done several programs with him, most recently last month. He is a gracious, modest guy who takes time to talk with students and staffers and shows genuine interest in them. He's also a good sport when kidded! ... I'm back from a Board of Directors meeting of the Association of Public Television Stations in Arlington, Virginia. The trip included a visit to Capitol Hill, beginning with a gathering in a beautiful Library of Congress room with ornate walls and ceiling. (They don't make government buildings like that anymore!) ... Federal funding for educational broadcasting declined with the nation's economic woes and likely will drop again this year. Hawaii U.S. Rep. **Colleen Hanabusa** addressed the group, hailing PBS Hawaii's **HIKI NŌ** student news network which was inspired by student media performance in her home district of Waianae. She called for PBS to maintain its principled programming. ... I learned more in D.C. about the history of broad bipartisan support. Of course, our late Senator **Daniel Inouye** was a prominent leader of this support. Republican Senator **Barry Goldwater** secured the first federal grant for the fledgling **Sesame Street**, and an icon of the modern conservative movement, President **Ronald Reagan**, blessed the successful public-private partnership that is at the core of public broadcasting when he told filmmaker **Ken Burns** that "government should provide the spark, and the private sector should do the rest." ... For every \$1 the federal government commits to PBS Hawaii, we raise \$7 from the private sector.

And that's my cue to thank YOU. ... In my life I've had a few excellent bosses. But none have I served with more joy than the people of Hawaii.

This month on PBS Hawaii, two global leaders share their stories, passions and struggles. In exclusive one-on-one conversations on **Long Story Short with Leslie Wilcox**, Burmese opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi and environmental activist Dr. Vandana Shiva share their stories with PBS Hawaii's President and CEO about their lives and ongoing work in their respective fields.

Earlier this year, with support provided by Rotary International, the Hawaii Community Foundation and Pillars of Peace Hawaii, Burmese opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi visited Oahu. In her

conversation with Wilcox, she shared the virtues of courage and compassion.

"I've never found it difficult to forgive," Suu Kyi told Wilcox. "I have come across many people who cannot forgive, who are full

of bitterness. Sometimes bitterness and anger are justified, but still, those are not positive feelings."

In 1989, after she sparked a nonviolent movement in Burma for human rights and democracy,

the Burmese government placed Suu Kyi under house arrest. Although given the option to flee the country, Suu Kyi chose to remain under house arrest until political prisoners were freed and the military returned the country to a civilian government. She was released in November 2010.

"I've never thought of what I did as sacrifice," Suu Kyi said. "It is a choice I made willingly."

Though Suu Kyi noted perfect peace is unattainable, she likened it to someone in the desert keeping his eye on a guiding star. "You have to keep your eye on it," the Burmese Parliament Member said. "It's not something you may ever reach, but you still have to keep on traveling towards that."

"You know, somehow conversations with me end up being about GMOs," Dr. Vandana Shiva told Leslie Wilcox.

The environmental activist and philosopher's stance against genetically modified agriculture was sure to come up in conversation. She revealed the turning point that sparked her passion for food and agriculture — her research in India's most prosperous state, Punjab, which Dr. Shiva describes as a land of chemical farming and bloodshed.

"I realized then that something had happened to the mind, and I called

it the monoculture of the mind," she said. "When you try to define the world in terms of a monoculture... you can't see diversity."

Dr. Shiva also opened up to Wilcox about her childhood in rural India, in the shadows of the Himalayas. There, in the valley of Dehra Dun, she learned from her mother, a farmer, about growing one's own food.

The six year old knew she wanted to be "a scientist with a social conscience." Growing up, her education in convents did not include science, so Dr. Shiva taught herself the subject and learned from college professors she tracked down. She would go on to earn degrees in physics and philosophy in Ontario, Canada.

Dr. Shiva concluded the conversation with an anecdote about her uncle, a former Monsanto chief:

"He used to debate with me about how he'd change the world, he'd make the perfect crop, the perfect child, the perfect this, the perfect that. And then, he had a child who was a mongoloid child, and he couldn't fix his son. Since that day, he became a different human being."

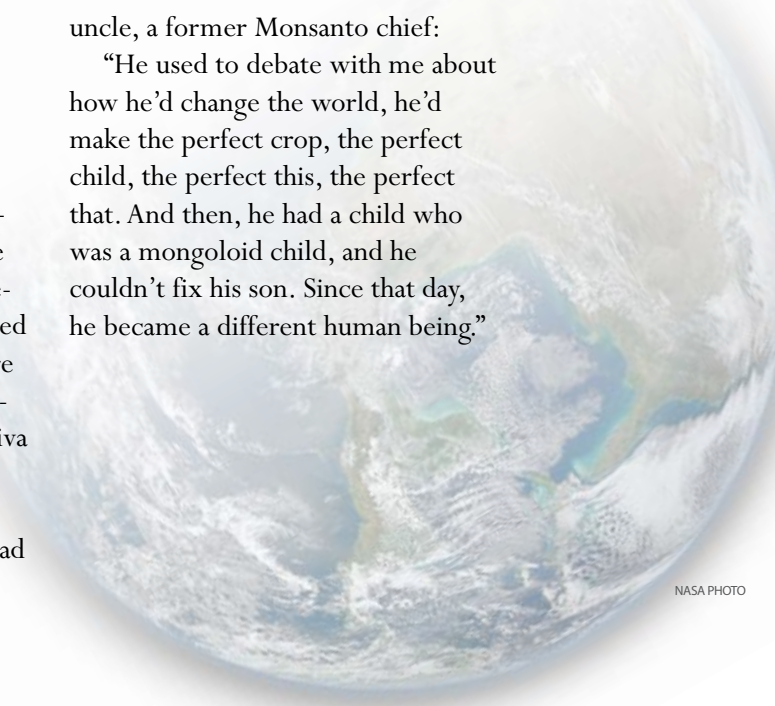

Q How does PBS Hawaii select NHK programs to broadcast? We particularly enjoyed *Festivals of the Orient* but haven't been able to find this program again.

A PBS Hawaii broadcasts a live satellite feed of **NHK World** Mondays – Fridays from 1:00 – 3:00 pm and Saturdays and Sundays from 6:00 – 7:00 pm. On Mondays – Fridays from 5:00 – 5:30 pm, we air a variety of select NHK World programs not included in the live feed.

Festivals of the Orient is a 10-minute mini-program which airs sporadically at either the end of the 6:00 – 7:00 pm hour on Saturdays or 1:00 – 3:00 pm on Fridays. NHK World schedules this mini-program irregularly and we regret not being able to inform our viewers accordingly.

Q When I ended my cable service, I could no longer receive PBS Hawaii via antenna. Some quick research revealed that you had moved your transmitter out of Honolulu. Why? How about improving transmitter delivery to Honolulu residents?

A In 2009, by federal mandate we changed our broadcast transmission system from analog to digital. At the same time, the Honolulu property which housed our transmitter was sold. We relocated our transmitter to Palehua in Makakilo.

Because digital data-rich signals behave differently in transmission, some sites which received analog signals before are not able to receive digital signals, while other sites which previously couldn't receive analog now get digital transmission.

This proved to be especially true in Honolulu where there are high-rises and valleys. In an effort to restore service to those who'd lost it, we applied twice to the Federal

Communications Commission for permission to maximize our power from Palehua. The FCC denied both requests, citing potential interference with their own operations.

Here is a possible fix. Using a different receiving system, viewers may be able to restore free over-the-air signal reception. You will need a high-gain directional antenna (rabbit ears just are not as good anymore) that's pointed in our direction to receive the signal. Please adjust your antenna gradually in small increments, then wait about 10 seconds between each move for the TV or converter box to reacquire the signal and display it. Antenna placement is very important when it comes to receiving the digital signal. Having the TV close to the antenna may not always produce the best results. Good luck with this approach. It worked for the viewer who raised this question and we want you to continue watching our programs on PBS Hawaii as well!

The Central Park Five

A Film by Ken Burns

On April 20, 1989, the body of a woman barely clinging to life was discovered in Central Park. Within days, Antron McCray, Kevin Richardson, Yusef Salaam, Raymond Santana and Korey Wise confessed to her rape and beating after many hours of aggressive interrogation at the hands of seasoned homicide detectives. The police announced to a press hungry for sensational crime stories that the young men had been part of a gang of teenagers who were out “wilding,” assaulting joggers and bicyclists in Central Park that evening.

The ensuing media frenzy was met with a public outcry for justice. The young men were tried as adults and convicted of rape, despite inconsistent and inaccurate confessions, DNA evidence that excluded them and no eyewitness accounts that connected any of them to the victim. The five served their complete sentences, between 6 and 13 years, before another man, serial rapist Matias Reyes, admitted to the crime and DNA testing supported his confession.

Set against the backdrop of a city beset by violence and facing deepening rifts between races and classes, **The Central Park Five** intertwines the stories of these five young men, the victim, police officers and prosecutors and Matias Reyes, unraveling the forces behind the wrongful convictions. The film illuminates how law enforcement, social institutions and media undermined the very rights of the individuals they were designed to safeguard and protect.

“This is a radical departure for me as a filmmaker,” said Ken Burns. “Eschewing narration, bringing in many new stylistic elements – I think the intensity of the circumstances and the political and tragic implications absolutely demanded that we implement an intensified discussion. What I think adds to our story is the humanity of the five young men who are at its center, especially because no one was willing to do that during the original media coverage and trial.”

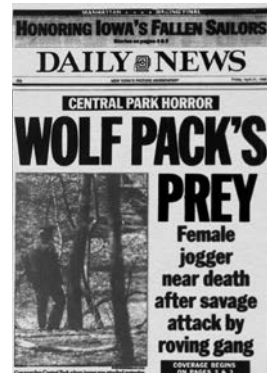
“This case is a lens through which we can understand the ongoing fault-line of race in America,” said Sarah Burns, who wrote *The Central Park Five: A Chronicle of a City Wilding* (Knopf, 2011). “These young men were convicted long before the trial, by a city blinded by fear and, equally, freighted by race. They were convicted because it was all too easy for people to see them as violent criminals simply because of the color of their skin.”

“Ultimately The Central Park Five is about human dignity,” said David McMahon. “It is about five young men who lose their youth but maintain their dignity in the face of an horrific and unimaginable situation.”

In 2002, based upon Matias Reyes’s confession, a judge vacated the original convictions of the group. A year later, the men filed civil lawsuits against the City of New York and the police officers and prosecutors who had worked toward their conviction. That lawsuit remains unresolved.
