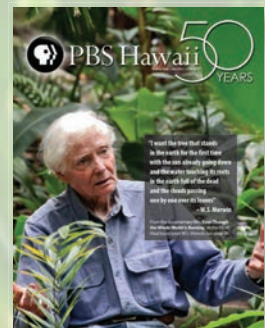

Designing for You



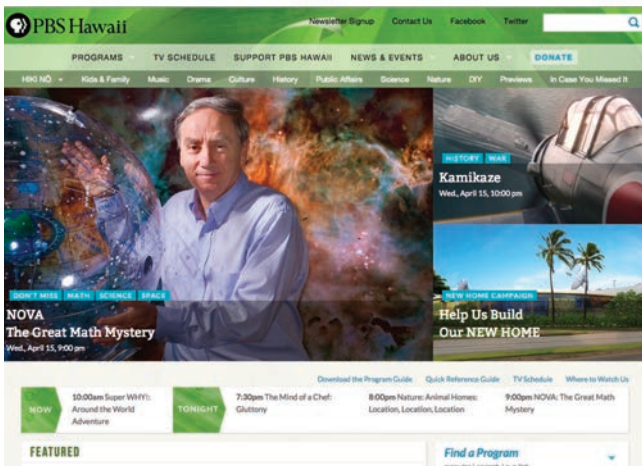

Responsive design. That's the term for the way we've rebuilt our PBS Hawaii web presence.

Launched last month, the new website at PBSHawaii.org reformats and adjusts to suit the device that you're using to access it. You can go from your desktop computer monitor to your tablet to your smartphone without laboring to enjoy the material. No need to laboriously pan and scroll to see the full information and images.

"This is so much easier for our viewers to use, and there's more efficiency for our staff in updating content," says Liberty Peralta, who oversaw development of the new website. It was designed for us locally by Ikeyzo, a creative agency and software development firm.

PBS Hawaii webmaster Brian Bueza notes that the website also brings users far more video, and lush photos and graphics. "It looks and feels more like television, while also being interactive."



The new responsive format of the PBS Hawaii website allows it to adapt to multiple platforms and devices.

Meanwhile, a very different kind of responsive design will be evident as construction continues on our NEW HOME at Nimitz Highway and Sand Island Access Road.

Our architect, Sheryl Seaman of Group 70 International, has designed a comfortable gathering place that's perfect for our role as a statewide connector and convener at The Clarence T.C. Ching Campus. It'll enable

the flexibility that people want for meetings in the 21st century, offering a pleasant environment with a lot of natural light, open spaces, reconfigurable seating and easy access to technology. Where acoustical privacy is important, conference rooms will have glass walls with a bit of artistic opaqueness. Our various departments (programming, local content production, communications, etc.) will not be a warren of cubicles and private offices; they'll be "coves," geared to a team approach. The overall effect will be one of openness, transparency and collaboration.

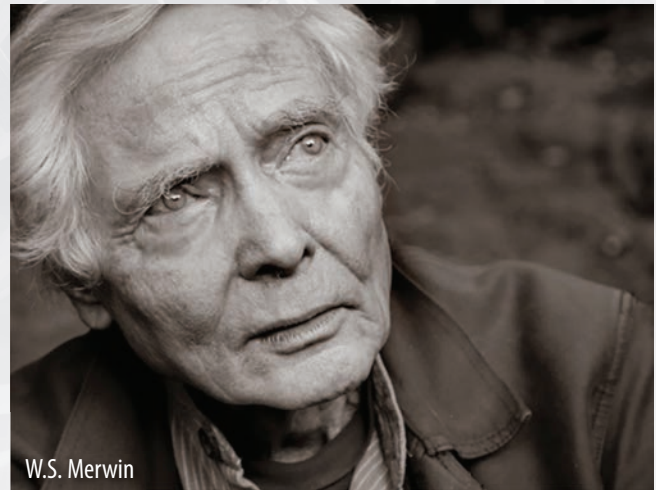
PBS Hawaii Presents Even Though the Whole World Is Burning

A New Film About Maui-based Poet W.S. Merwin
Thursday, May 28 at 9:00 pm

In the first few minutes of **Even Though the Whole World Is Burning**, W.S. Merwin remembers a poignant time from his childhood, in West Hoboken, New Jersey.

“On my 11th birthday, I went with Billy Green for a hike up in the mountains. We came over to this one place we both liked... where you came up a ridge in the woods, and it was very beautiful, you looked over to the next ridge... and we came up to the ridge and there wasn’t anything there. There was a steam shovel down at the bottom of it. And this whole top of the mountain was gone, and there was this great ditch. Nothing. And I just stood there with tears running down my face. And I thought, ‘I don’t know why anybody would do this.’ It’s wrong. It’s absolutely wrong. You can’t just get rid of a place like that. And I never got over it. I still feel that way. I don’t want to treat any part of the living world that way.”

In *Even Though the Whole World Is Burning*, Maui-based producer/director Stefan Schaefer walks gently through the life of former U.S. Poet Laureate W.S. Merwin...as gently as Merwin walks through his 19-acre back yard on Maui, densely populated with palms planted by the two-time Pulitzer Prize winner.



“I was certainly humbled by my initial encounters with him, but the incredible thing about him is he...he connects with people. He listens to them, he constantly has questions for others, so he has a way of connecting with everybody,” Schaefer recalls. Schaefer’s camera travels with Merwin to book signings, to reading tours, to Merwin’s farmhouse in France. Photos of Merwin as a child, young boy and young man paint a moving picture of Merwin’s life, while archival film clips document the times through which Merwin has lived. Friends, family, academics and Paula Merwin, the poet’s wife, lend their words to speak of this man of words. And woven throughout the film is the serenity of Merwin caring for his palms, creating a living place from what was once considered a wasteland.

“I think a lot of people who love palms have that feeling that you’re dealing with our elders...of great, great antiquity. They’re here a long time, and they know more about the earth in some ways than we do,” Merwin says.

Sprinkled throughout the film are moments where Merwin recites passages from his own poetry...his cadence and soft voice pull the viewer into the words. And the unpunctuated written lines become alive.

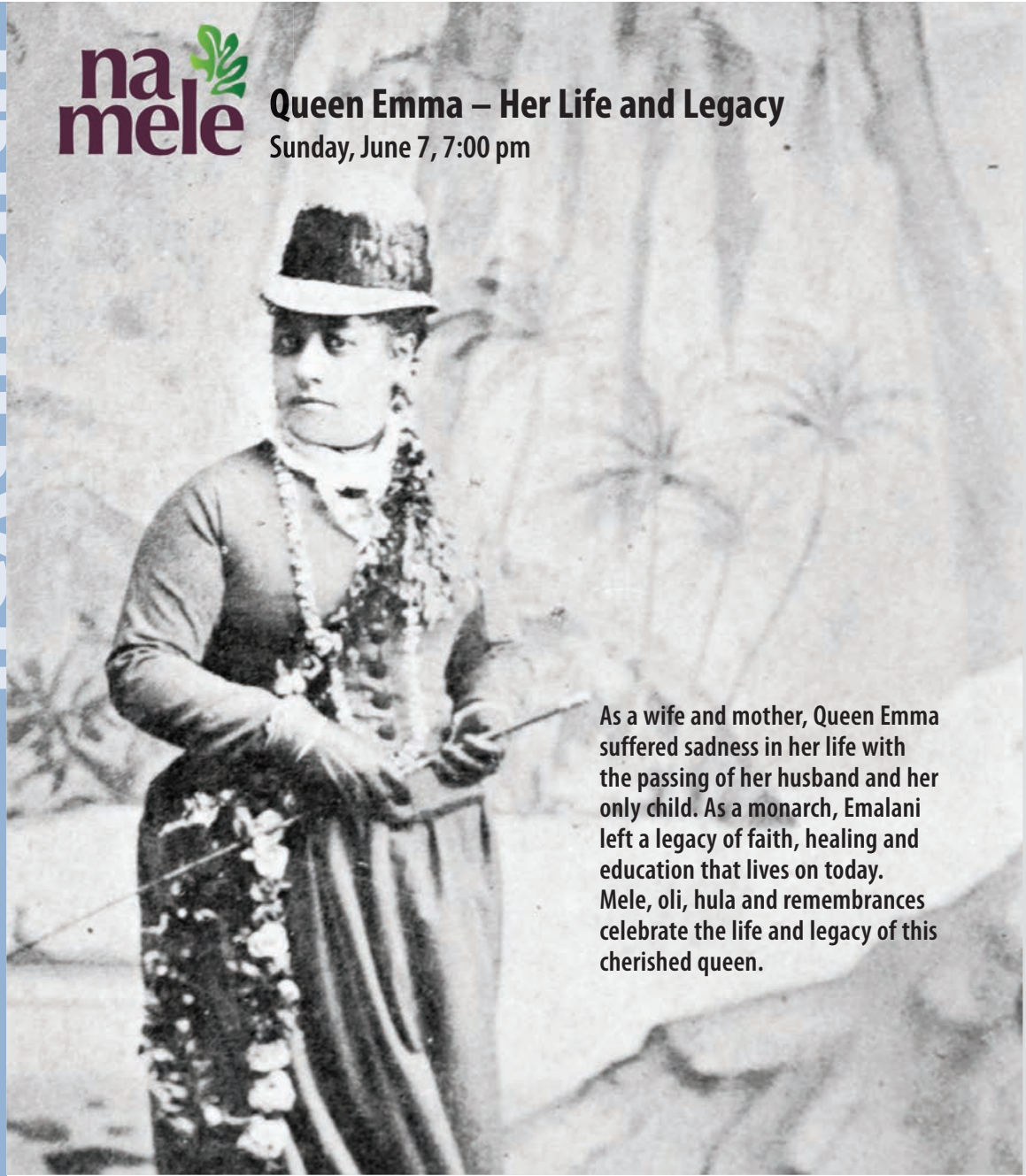
