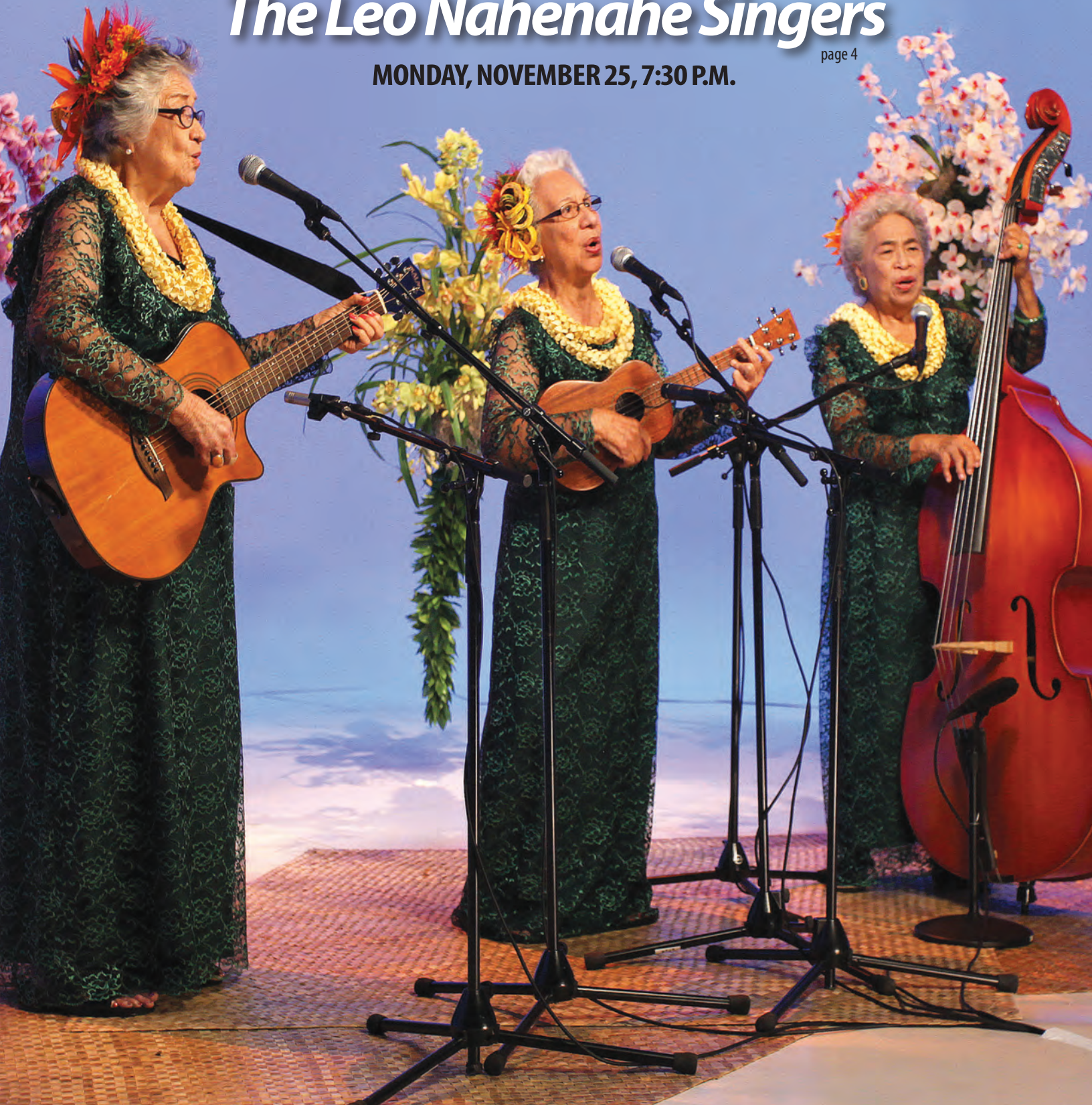

**L***eo nahenahe* is Hawaiian for “soft and sweet voices.” It’s an accurate description of the sound of The Leo Nahenahe Singers, but don’t be fooled. They’re not pushovers – especially when it comes to music.

“When I got married, I told my husband, ‘Just remember this: I’m going to play music. You don’t stop me from playing music,’” says Noelani K. Mahoe, singer and ukulele player. “He never did. Music is my life.”

After 50 years together, The Leo Nahenahe Singers – Noelani, along with Ethelynn Teves and Mona Teves – will be featured in a new episode of **Na Mele**. It premieres Monday, November 25 at 7:30 pm.

The group formed in 1963. Back then, Noelani was teaching *hula* with Honolulu Parks and Recreation. One

Until you do, “you have no idea what that place is like,” says Noelani. The research is essential for her, because “it’s important not to just sing a song for the sake of singing. [We] can say these are the favorite songs of these people we’re singing about.” One example was a memorable visit to Ka‘u while learning “Hanohano Wale No,” the *paniolo* song that takes place on Hawaii Island.

Music is a means of storytelling that can offer more than just enjoyment – it can change lives. Noelani talks about a letter she received from a man now living in Afghanistan. As a child he attended Pope Elementary in Waimanalo and sang in the student chorus she directed.

“He said he used to get picked on by one of the boys, but I didn’t realize that then,” Noelani recalls, who used

of her students was Ethelynn Teves, the group’s guitarist. Mona Teves, who plays upright bass, is Ethelynn’s sister-in-law by marriage.

In their heyday, The Leo Nahenahe Singers toured Asia, Europe and North America, with the help of Aloha Airlines and the Hawaii Visitors Bureau. They recorded four albums, including *Hawaiian Christmas*, their revered holiday album. Earlier this year, they received the Nā Hōkū Hanohano Lifetime Achievement Award.

“This year is the frosting on the cake,” Mona says.

The Leo Nahenahe Singers are in their 80s now, and only perform on special occasions. That doesn’t mean their passion for music and Hawaiian culture has been put aside. When PBS Hawaii caught up with Noelani, she was preparing for a trip to Mexico City to teach *hula* there.

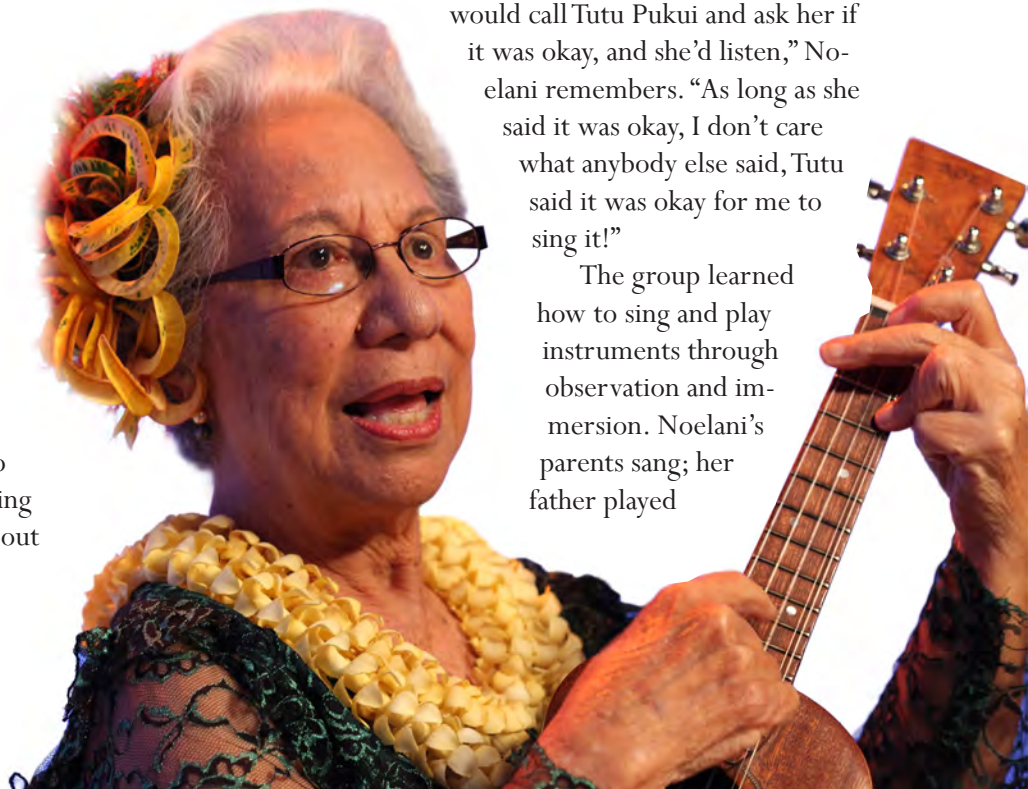
As evidenced by the photos in her garage, Noelani has traveled a great deal overseas and has done a lot of interisland travel, too. She especially felt it important to visit sites throughout the islands while learning place name songs, not only to learn more about the place but the people who lived there.

music as a way to instill self-confidence in her students. “Now he sings all the time.”

She has one piece of advice for young Hawaiian music singers: pronounce the words correctly. That’s no surprise when you learn of Noelani’s pedigree: she studied Hawaiian language under Samuel Elbert, the scholar and Hawaiian dictionary co-author. Fellow scholar and co-author Mary Kawena Pukui was also a family friend.

“Before I would learn a song, I would call Tutu Pukui and ask her if it was okay, and she’d listen,” Noelani remembers. “As long as she said it was okay, I don’t care what anybody else said, Tutu said it was okay for me to sing it!”

The group learned how to sing and play instruments through observation and immersion. Noelani’s parents sang; her father played

guitar. Ethelynne's grandmother sang, too. "During our time, we couldn't afford to do any kind of formal instruction, but there was music all around," Mona remembers.

How have The Leo Nahenahe Singers remained together for so many years?

"We enjoy the company of each other and our families," declares Noelani.

"Being humble and patient," adds Mona. "When you're doing music, every day is like a learning experience."

Played out amidst the chaos in Dallas, the hospital and the CBS newsroom in New York is the riveting story of the reporting itself, from the moment President Kennedy was shot until Cronkite's emotional pronouncement of his death at 1:00 pm CST.

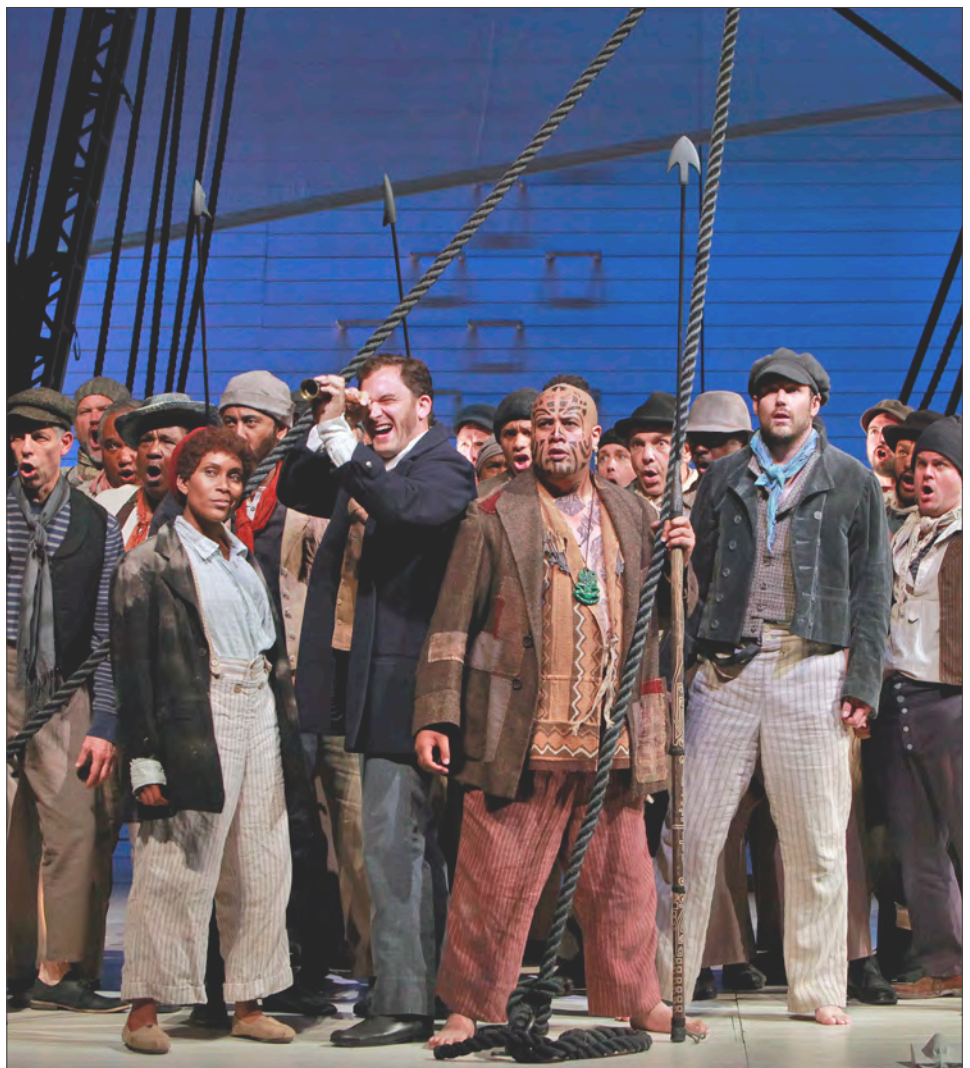

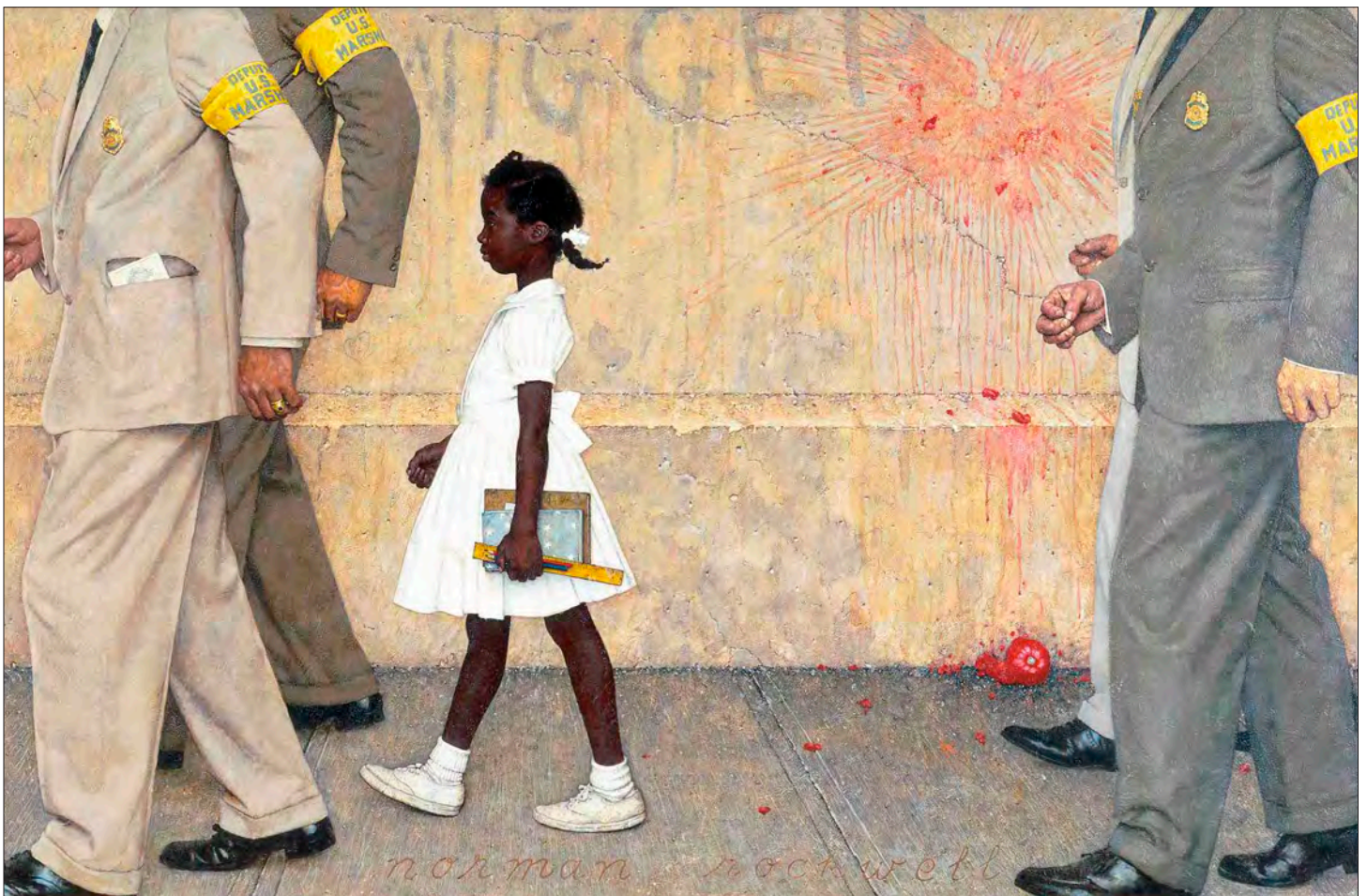

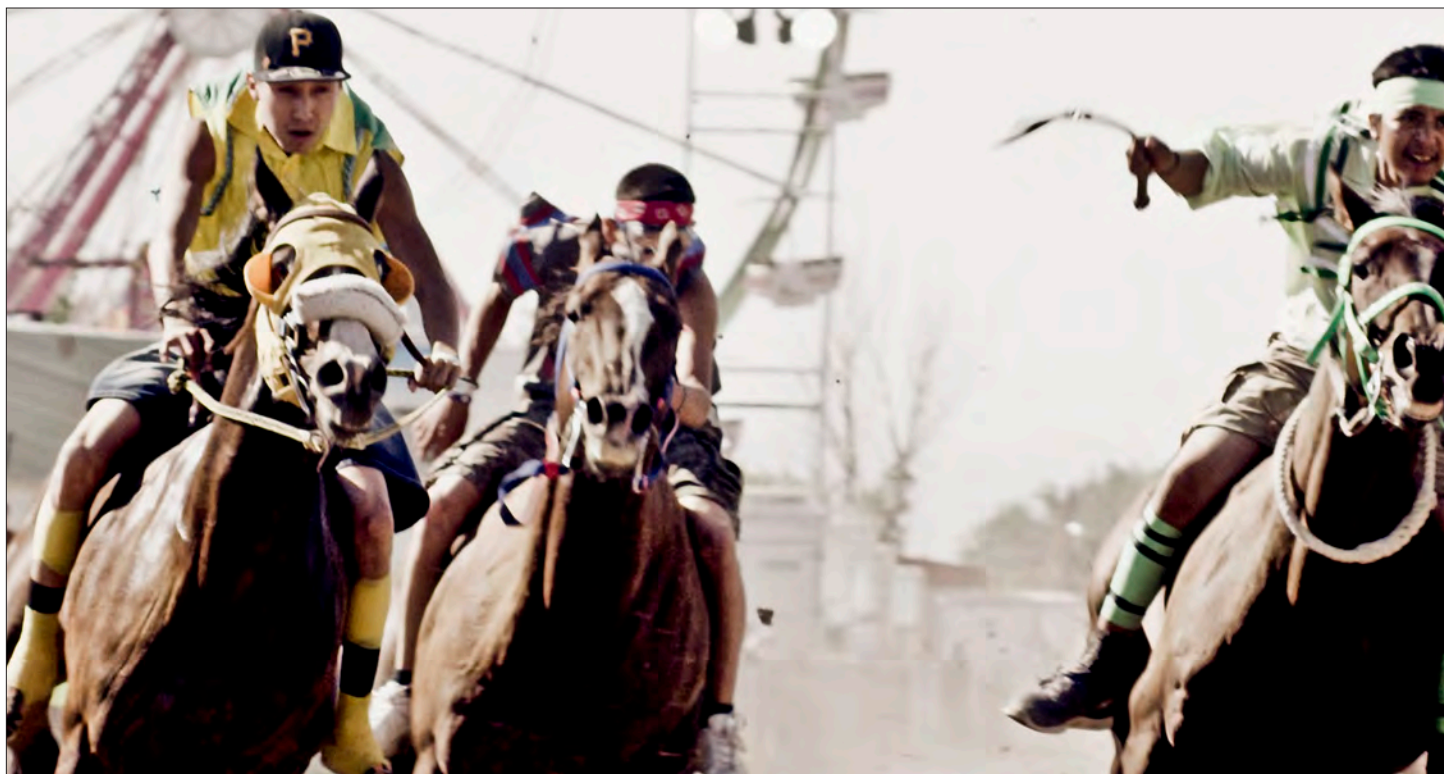
